'BELL'S PALSY'

I refer to 'Bell's Palsy – a retrospective study'. by Dr. Diong Ko Ing (MMJ Vol. XXVIII, No. 4, June 1974 ppg. 248–250).

I quote Professor Wong Hock Boon's C.P.C. notes dated December, 1974 on Facial Palsy.....' If left alone, Bell's Palsy usually recover fully or partially in 96%, leaving 4% with residual palsy.... conservative means such as *steroids* have *not* proved to improve these prognostic fugures....'. I presume Professor Wong's fegures are for the paediatric age group; I would be grateful for your comments on any comparable fugures for adults.

It is said that the first 72 hours are the most critical period to determine whether patients are going to improve. Therefore I fail to understand Dr. Diong's opinion, "that all patients with Bell's Palsy presenting within *one month*... should be given a trial (steroids".
